- Merciful God, we remember those who have died and those who are bereaved. May the light of Christ which eternally shines bring hope to their dark places. We especially pray for those whose anniversary falls at this time.
- Gracious God, forgive us when we only turn to you when things trouble us and when we forget to thank you for your blessings. Help us to see how precious and worth protecting all the wonderful people and things in our world are. Give us your strength for today, your hope for tomorrow, and the light of your love to guide us in all things.
